Support for Local Climate Action

Assistance for each community to define their best strategies for:

- Reducing emissions, cutting costs of energy use
- Building resiliency in the face of climate change
- Transitioning to a green economy

One of the few programs where local gov'ts can find:

- Free technical support on energy and climate issues

What are the benefits?

- **Free technical assistance:**
 - Regional coordinators through NYSERDA
- **Guidance & tools:**
 - Extensive website: EE, RE, preparing for severe weather
 - Monthly webinars, email list, decision-support tools, certification = framework for action
- **Funding:** better positioned to compete for funds; CSC grants via [CFA](#)
- **Leadership recognition:** state-level attention for local leaders, esp. for Certified CSCs
- **Networking:** learn with like-minded community leaders

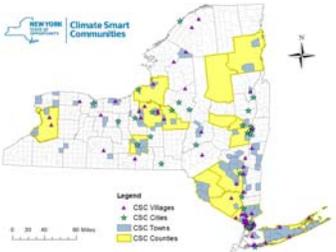


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Climate Smart Communities



Since 2009:

- 198 Registered CSCs
- 10 Certified CSCs
- One-third of New Yorkers
 - 6.7 M people in CSCs
- Smallest: V. of Van Etten (537)
- Largest: Suffolk County (1.5 M)

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Registered vs. Certified Climate Smart Community

- **Registered** = making a commitment
 - Local gov't passes a formal municipal resolution adopting the 10-point CSC Pledge
- **Certified** = leaders who've made concrete progress
 - Accumulate points through documented actions to achieve Certified, Bronze, Silver or Gold levels
 - 1-10 points per action, 130+ total possible actions
 - Range of action types: planning, policies, outreach, implementation, etc.

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Climate Smart Communities Grants

Who is eligible to apply?

- Local governments only
 - Counties, cities, towns, villages in NYS
 - Do NOT need to be a Registered CSC
 - Other entities (non-profits, etc.) can be partners but not lead applicant

- Deadline is **July 28, 2017** at 4 PM

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Climate Smart Communities Grants

What is the match?

- Required local **match is 50%** of eligible project costs
- Eligible costs include: travel & equipment
 - Salaries & fringe benefits
 - Contractual services
- Match w/ in-kind municipal staff salaries
- No state or federal funds as match



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Climate Smart Communities Grants

What kinds of projects are eligible?

- Climate change projects that:
 - Reduce GHGs from *non-power* sources (mitigation)
 - Build local resiliency to climate change (adaptation)
 - Are needed based on climate science





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CSC Grants for Implementation



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CSC Grants for Implementation

- Total available: \$9.5M
- Larger awards: **\$10,000 to \$2 million**
- **Construction** projects - no more than 15% on design & engineering
- Two broad categories of implementation:
 - Adaptation
 - Mitigation (reducing GHGs from non-power sources)




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CSC Grants for Implementation

Eligible adaptation project categories:

- Reduce future flood risk (1 of 2):
 - Increase natural resiliency (e.g., living shorelines)
 - Relocate or retrofit critical infrastructure or facilities
 - Replace or right-size flow barriers (i.e., culverts & bridges)



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CSC Grants for Implementation

Eligible adaptation projects:

- Extreme event preparation (2 of 2):
 - Address anticipated future extreme heat conditions
 - E.g., cooling centers, shade structures
 - Improve emergency preparedness and response systems
 - E.g., warning systems that facilitate emergency response and/or protect people, infrastructure and natural resources



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CSC Grants for Implementation

Eligible mitigation projects:

- Reduce GHGs from:
 - **Commuting:** more walkable, bike-able routes to work
 - **Food scraps:** increase food donation, or process food scraps at wastewater treatment plants
 - **Landfills:** install methane capture systems, etc.
 - **Refrigerants:** switch to alternatives, or reduce leakage from refrigeration, chillers, & A/C equipment



CSC Grants for Certification



CSC Grants for Certification

- Total available: \$500,000
- Smaller awards: \$10,000 to \$100,000
- **Planning projects**
 - 24 different types of assessments, inventories, plans that align with the CSC Certification Program

CSC Grants for Certification

- **Climate Change Adaptation Strategies** - 4 of 10 options:
 - Vulnerability assessments (7.1)
 - Review existing plans and projects to identify adaptation strategies (CSRP – 7.3)
 - Update multi-hazard mitigation plan to address changing conditions (7.6)
 - Watershed assessment to identify flooding priorities (7.10)
- **Land-Use Planning** – 2 of 3 options:
 - Update comprehensive plan w/ sustainability & smart growth elements (6.1, 6.2)
 - Natural Resources Inventory (6.17)



CSC Grants for Certification

▪ **Transportation Strategies** – 2 of 3 options:

- Plan for right-sizing municipal fleet (3.11)
- Develop strategies that support bicycling and walking (6.10)

▪ **Organic Waste Mgmt. Strategies** – 2 of 7 options:

- Develop a plan to provide organic waste collection and composting in local gov't bldgs. (3.21)
- Conduct local gov't waste audit and track diversion rate over time (3.23)



Pass/Fail Criteria for All CSC Grant Projects

- You are a local gov't of NYS and you've submitted a **municipal resolution authorizing application submission**.
- You are proposing an eligible action and have clearly described the need for the project in reference to **projected future climate conditions or greenhouse gas inventory data**.
- You have attached a **completed expenditure budget** that itemizes costs and clearly articulates the requested funding amount and eligible match.
- You have attached a **detailed work program** outlining what specific tasks will be undertaken to complete the project, from initiation through completion.
- If applicable, you have documented **land ownership or an agreement with the landowner for land access and use**.



Add'l Evaluation Criteria for CSC Grants

- Financial hardship
- Climate Smart Communities status: Registered or Certified CSC
- Implementation or certification readiness
- Project criticality
- Effectiveness of proposal
- Planning context
- Quality of application
- Reasonableness of cost
